Social Studies And Science

Social Studies–We will continue studying our school community. We will understand that our school is a community that we are a part of. At home: talk to your child about places in the school building.

Science–We will continue our study on the needs of living things. We will plant seeds and discuss what they need to thrive. At home: read books or watch videos about plants.

Math

Students will learn to count to 10. This includes counting 10 objects, writing the numbers clearly, and recognizing numbers when they are shown to the children. The children will also compare numbers to 5 using language like: equal to, greater than, and less than. At home, you can use objects around the house to have children create a group to represent a number. You can use blocks, food, coins, or anything you have a set of. Use these same groups to compare different amounts of objects.

ELA

Phonics– Students will continue learning letters and sounds. We will focus on the letters c, o, a, g, d, s, e and r. At home, continue to practice saying the names of letters and the sounds they make. Also, practice writing the letters carefully and neatly.

Reading–We will focus on listening to stories, discussing the stories with our peers, and answering questions about the stories we've read. We will also introduce the concept of problem and solution. At home, please read every night. After reading, ask your child questions about what happened in the book. Have your child identify the characters, setting, problem and solution.

Writing–Students will work on writing narrative stories. This includes planning a story by talking with a peer and identifying the characters and setting in his/her story. We will practice using the letters we've learned to attempt writing words and will share our work with friends. At home, help your child generate ideas for a story. This can be talking about something fun you've done or places you've gone together.
